

## Medicines to Control your Nausea and Vomiting

Nausea is a common side effect of this treatment. Every person responds differently. Below are directions for taking medicine that may help an upset stomach. For more information please review the Chemotherapy and Immunotherapy Patient Guide page 23.

Your doctor has ordered the medicines checked below for you.

- Take ***Dexamethasone (Decadron)*** \_\_\_\_\_mg (\_\_\_\_\_ tabs). Take in the morning with food to decrease an upset stomach starting on day **before/ after** chemotherapy for \_\_\_\_\_ days.
  
- Take ***Prochlorperazine (Compazine)*** \_\_\_\_\_mg. only if you have an upset stomach. Take it when you **begin** to feel sick. **Do NOT wait until you throw up.** May take every \_\_\_\_\_ hours as needed.
  
- Take ***Ondansetron (Zofran)*** \_\_\_\_\_mg. only if you have an upset stomach. Take it when you **begin** to feel sick. **Do NOT wait until you throw up.** May take every \_\_\_\_\_ hours as needed.
  
- Take ***Olanzapine (Zyprexa)*** \_\_\_\_\_mg. every \_\_\_\_\_ hours.
